As with last year, there is a silver lining to holding a virtual event—all staff, students, alumni, postdocs, and volunteers can take part, making this year's graduation both inclusive and meaningful.

I invite you to join our commencement virtually at 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 27, by live streaming the ceremony on Facebook, YouTube, and our Commencement page. (A link will be provided in my next commencement notice, closer to the event.)
