Introduction

DR. MARTIN SURKS is a household name in the thyroid community and internationally known not just for his research and publications but also for being an outstanding speaker and teacher. Like many of us he has lost count of the many fellows he has trained while for >20 years he was division chief and then for the next 20 years the fellowship director at Albert Einstein School of Medicine. I have no doubt there are many readers of this journal who will enjoy hearing from him. On December 7, 2021, I was able to persuade Marty Surks to talk with me about his life. Nevertheless, such interviews do require preparation and follow-up. The general approach is to start with a single narrative if possible and with only minor interruptions. In the second session, it is appropriate to try and draw out some of the more important experiences that are revealed and in a third session new points can be incorporated that may have been overlooked, forgotten, or too controversial. In the histories I have reported, the first session has always been the most important and the most revealing, and with Dr. Surks this was performed by telephone. 




