

Weapons Policy

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Policy is to outline the Albert Einstein College of Medicine's Weapons Policy.

II. Scope

This Policy applies to all employees, students, visitors and guests at Albert Einstein College of Medicine

III. Policy

The possession of any weapon (as defined in local, state and federal statutes, and includes, without limitation, firearms, whether loaded or unloaded, knives and explosives), whether concealed or otherwise, on any College of Medicine campus is strictly prohibited. This prohibition applies to all facilities owned, leased or otherwise controlled by the College of Medicine, and whether academic, residential or otherwise.

In accordance with New York State Penal Law section 265.01-A, as amended, **no** person other than a police officer, peace officer or individual employed in a security capacity at the College of Medicine who has been issued a NYS special armed guard registration card¹ and who has written permission from the College of Medicine may possess a rifle, shotgun or firearm on the College of Medicine campus. Written permission shall only be granted by the College of Medicine once the aforementioned criteria is met and upon review by the Associate Dean for Finance and Administration in conjunction with the Executive Dean.

Failure to comply with this Policy may result in disciplinary action by the College of Medicine (up to and including, in the case of a student, suspension or expulsion and, in the case of an employee, termination of employment) and also may result in criminal prosecution. In addition, the College of Medicine reserves the right to confiscate the weapon. This policy applies to all members of the College of Medicine community as well as visitors and guests, and **regardless of whether the possessor is licensed to carry that weapon elsewhere.**

¹ NYS General Business Law Section 89-F(12) defines "special armed guard registration card" to mean a registration card issued by the department [NYS Department of State] signifying that the individual thereon has been certified by the department to perform security guard functions and to carry firearms in connection with such functions. Nothing herein contained shall relieve such guard from any provision of law which requires that he or she be licensed to carry such firearm.
