IMPORTANT EXAM FAILURE BY-LAWS AT A GLANCE

\rightarrow EXAM FAILURES:

- The course is failed only if you are required to take and fail the Make-Up Exam.
- Histology Practical and Written exams and Anatomy Practical and Anatomy Written exams are considered one exam. The exams that "count" are marked with a "*" on the people page.

\rightarrow TWO MAKE-UP EXAM LIMIT:

- Only **TWO** Make-Up Exams for failed courses are allowed in a single year. If there is a third course failure then one of the courses will need to be made up the following year.
- **MCFM** and **Anatomy** are mega courses. A full course Make-Up exam of either MCFM or Anatomy counts as two Make-Up exams.

→ MAKE-UP EXAMS AND TRANSCRIPTS:

- If a first year student passes the Make-Up Exam, the course will not reflect an "F" on their transcript. Thus, a "P" will appear for the course on their transcript, regardless of previous exam failures in the course.
- If a first year student fails the Make-Up Exam, and takes the course again the following year, and passes the course, the "F" will be on their transcript for failing the Make-Up Exam. However a "P" will also show for having passed the course.

\rightarrow THREE EXAM FAILURES BEFORE WINTER RECESS:

• The failure of three exams prior to the winter recess period of Year 1, Mid-terms and /or Finals, for any reason, will automatically require the development of a customized schedule without recourse to the Committee on Student Promotions and Professional Standards or the Dean – even if graduation is thereby postponed.

\rightarrow FOUR EXAM FAILURES DURING 1ST YEAR:

• The failure of four exams during Year 1, Mid-terms and/or Finals, for any reason, will automatically require the development of a customized schedule – without recourse to the Committee on Student Promotions and Professional Standards or the Dean – even if graduation is thereby postponed.
